ESMT, the Berlin business school, is offering free language lessons. Keen to see its MBAs stay in Germany, it is working with the Goethe Institute to give students enrolling on the MBA full-time programme (which is in English) before August, a two-month intensive course in German.

Based on improving healthcare system performance and management, it is in collaboration with Novartis, the pharmaceutical company. Students must be on a listed programme (see the school website) and first prize is €5,000. The deadline is April 22.

The Executive MBA programme in Moscow, which starts in October, includes two weeks in Belgium, 17 monthly four-day modules in Moscow, and a study trip to MIT in the US.
